Bylaw 19-1485

Thanks to all who expressed their concerns to Temagami Town Council, regarding the Municipal Land Use By-Law, that was to allow the Town to clean up and remove derelict vehicles, trailers, ice huts and miscellaneous materials on Municipal lands, including landings.

Initially, the Town had intended to begin ticketing vehicles, and requiring permits, as of July 2021.

The Town has now decided that vehicles and trailers with current licence (registration) plates will be exempt from the By-Law. The By-Law will now deal primarily with ice huts, abandoned vehicles and trailers (un-plated), etc. Council will be re-visiting the By-Law in October, to work out further details.

Canada 150 Tree

In early July, an Autumn Blaze Maple tree was donated by CALA, to the Temagami Family Health Clinic. On hand for the presentation, were Sue Olynyk, and Paul Middleton.

Camp 16

On June 10th, the MNRF were at the Camp 16 site, to conduct a clean up of the area. Upon their visit, and seeing the bad state that it was in, they made the decision to supply materials for the construction of 6 privies.

Renewal of Northern Corridor

As part of the 2021 Ontario Budget, the government committed \$5 million to support planning and design work for a 13-stop train route, that would provide service from Toronto to Timmins or Cochrane, by the mid 2020's.
